1. Are you a member of another political party? If so, which ones? Have you ever supported or given money to a candidate from another party in a partisan race? If so, whom? No.

2. Are you a member of your local Democratic District Party? Have you contributed financially to the County Democratic Party? Have you been a Precinct Committee Officer? When/Where?

I support the Democratic Party through my active evolvement with organized labor and our collective efforts to financially support and elect democratic candidates. I have contributed to numerous Democratic candidates in local elections and state wide elections. I serve on the Executive Board of the King County Labor Council, AFL-CIO and serve as the chair of the Political Action Committee.

3. What are the main messages of your campaign? What is your campaign plan? How many doors have you knocked on to date, pieces of mail planned, budgeting, staffing? Why will you win? What is the fundraising goal for your campaign? How much have you raised to date?

Port security, creating family wage jobs, protecting our quality of life as an environmental steward. The campaign plan is centered around targeted mailing and doorbelling to selected precincts. We are doing our doorbelling blitz in August and September to get maximum reach to voters. I have budgeted for staffing (Moxie Media, Barbara Chadwick), but the bulk of the budget is for direct contact with voters.

I will win with the support of the Democratic Party, the labor community and the environmental community. The King County Labor Council has targeted my candidacy for their Labor-Neighbor program, which will yield enormous support from around King County. I have been endorsed by the Port of Seattle Firefighters and dozens of major unions in King County who will donate directly, volunteer, and inform their members about my candidacy.

My fund raising goal depends on the competition. The initial goal is \$75,000.00 and as of 7-1-05 I have raised \$56,165.

4. What is the single most pressing issue facing your jurisdiction, and what actions would you take if elected?

Port of Seattle security and the accountability of the Port to our citizens. When I get on the Port Commission, I will ask for the complete plan that the Sea-Port and Sea-Tac Airport divisions have for dealing with natural disasters/terrorist incidents. I will push for accountability of container traffic coming in and out of our seaport.

In addition, I would ask that a regular number of Port Commission meeting be conducted in other locations than the airport and Pier 69. The citizens of King County should be given an opportunity to see how decisions are made by the Commission and given greater access to commission meetings.
